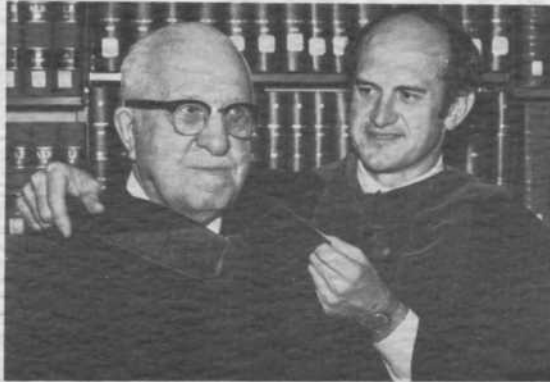

FRED O. DENNIS
January 21, 1893 - April 1, 1983

The late Fred O. Dennis was founder and, until his death, President of Dennis and Company, Buffalo, New York, a firm specializing in the publication of law reports, journals and out-of-print materials for lawyers, law firms and law libraries. His law book career began at age 14 as a sales representative for a book firm. His own company began in 1920 and its eminent success is a tribute to the character, vision and devotion to hard work of its founder who, in the finest of American traditions, saw a need, filled it, prospered, and then selflessly shared his prosperity greatly with the profession he served so long.

His substantial gift last fall toward endowment of the Law Library at Campbell University School of Law was but one measure of the philanthropy of this warm, personable gentleman who has touched the lives of many legal scholars, young and old alike, through his business and his magnanimity. He has enriched the legal profession through publication of volumes not readily available elsewhere, in his fidelity to service, and by the generosity of his stewardship. His assistance to the Campbell Law Library in its formative stages was of inestimable worth and his recent, generous contribution to the Law Library's forthcoming endowment drive will doubtless be an inspiration to others and an assurance of its success.

Mr. Dennis was honored in 1979 when Campbell College recognized his many contributions to legal education and the profession by the award of an honorary Doctor of Laws degree. Ill health since his recent gift prevented Mr. Dennis from returning to our campus and his death on April 1, 1983 has denied us the occasion to honor him again in person. But today, we proudly declare that henceforth the Law Library at Campbell University School of Law will be known as the "Fred O. Dennis Law Library". To his fond memory the library is this day dedicated.
